## New events, attractions coming for 2022 Field Day show

We participated in Amelia Day in April and we planned and executed our first *Celebrate Independence!* event in conjunction with the 100-Mile Yard Sale.

The reception and support we have received from the Amelia commu-

The big news is the construction of a new pulling track on the grounds. The hillside overlooking the track will offer a phenomenal view of both the tractor and truck pulls.

Some of the rides which were used in Rockville have been relocated to Amelia and will be used as stationary seating. Please take advantage of them.

# New pulling track is highlight for 2022 Field Day

Bring a blanket, bring a chair...our new pulling track has viewing room to spare!

Immediately after the 2021 Field Day of the Past, it was obvious that changes needed to be made to the show grounds. Not only were we faced with a deadline for moving collections, buildings, etc. from Rockville, but improvements also needed to be made in the layout for the 2022 show. In November, 2021, Field Day volunteers Kenny Paulette, Luke and Bruce Whitaker, Greg Miller and Pope Reed met on the Amelia grounds to discuss changes. We realized after last year's show that the pulling track location was not ideal. After looking at the possibilities of a new location, these volunteers discovered that the ideal

site was the hillside behind the sawmill. The site posed a number of challenges, however — how to mold a mountain (and several molehills) into a serviceable track area.

Come Spring 2022, Reed and Paulette, joined by volunteer Tony Easter, who used a bulldozer and a tractor equipped with a front end loader and York rake to conquer the mountains and molehills.

Given that none of the three were pullers and had never been involved in building a track, the trio consulted track builder Barbee Cox for his expertise. He stopped periodically to offer advice and support. With each of his inspections, Cox commented "You are looking good. See if you can make it longer!" And make it longer, the volunteers did.



The new Field Day of the Past pulling track stretches 560 feet in length and is 60 feet across, providing Field Day with a venue to host a multiple of other pulling events in the future.

The final track stretches 560 feet and spans 60 feet across. Finishing work

continues but the new pulling surface will be ready for show days.

Although these three volunteers spearheaded the track construction, many others lent their skills, time, and energy to its completion. We would like to thank Joseph Borum with Sailors' Creek Investment (SCI) Logging and Grading; Wright's






# Putt-putt engines, antique tractors, old farming equipment join ranks of exhibitors at Field Day of the Past



Most often, when we consider the Industrial Revolution we think of the large effects mechanization brought to the world — big things like Eli Whitney's cotton gin, Robert Fuller's steam boat, Samuel F.B. Morse's telegraph, Elias Howe's sewing machine and Edison's light bulb. We envision manufacturing plants springing up almost overnight and railroads steaming cross the country carrying passengers and goods.

There's no doubt, the Industrial Revolution shifted the focus in America (and the rest of the world) from an agriculturally based economy to a mechanized one. Industrialization, however, did not wipe out agricultural America. It did, however, change the lives of American farmers and their families.

The small engine alone changed the way farmers went about their livelihoods of raising crops and tending animals and the lifestyles of their

wives in every day chores of washing, cooking and keeping their families.

Whereas many farmers still maintained horses and mules to plow and harvest their grains, primarily because of economic reasons, the evolution of the tractor into their daily lives made making a living a bit easier. The introduction of the small engine became the backbone of many of the "new fangled" inventions which found their ways onto the farms. Engines not only powered combines and threshing machines but also cream separators,

washing machines, vacuum cleaners and generators for inside lights.

While the life of the farmer was never, and still is not, an easy one, the small engine offered a more efficient, faster way of accomplishing tasks both inside and outside the house.

We invite you to partake of this piece of history at the 2022 Field Day of the Past and see just how "easy" these engines made life.

# TIPS FOR SURVIVING FIELD DAY OF THE PAST 2022

## Welcome to Field Day of the Past

We would like your visit to be a pleasant and fun one. We have designed these tips to provide information on what you are about to experience and some suggestions to help you make the most of your time with us. Browse through the guide before you leave home, and bring it with you.

## Who, What, When and Where

Let us introduce ourselves. Field Day of the Past is an annual event sponsored by the Rockville-Centerville Steam & Gas Historical Assoc, a nonprofit organization operating under Section 501(c)(3) of the Codes of the Internal Revenue Service. The event is organized and manned by volunteers and we always welcome a new face.

The show grounds are located at Redfield Farm, 11404 Circle Dr. just off Rt. 360 in Amelia County, six miles east of Amelia Courthouse. This address is the Appomattox River Park and Ride. The grounds are directly behind the parking lot. Signs will be posted on Rt. 360 from both directions to direct you into the parking lot. Parking is free and trams are available in the parking lot to the gate. **The best way to avoid the traffic is to arrive early, particularly on Saturday.**

Show days are Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 16-18. The gates open at 8 a.m. and most exhibits shut down at 6 p.m. Truck events are held at 7 p.m. on Friday and 6 p.m. on Saturday. Sunday hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Adult admission is \$20 per person per day. Guests 65 and older will be admitted for \$15. Children 12 years and younger are free.

Tickets are available online at [www.fielddayofthepast.net](http://www.fielddayofthepast.net) for \$15 daily and block tickets are available for \$125 for a 10 tickets. These will remain on sale until noon on Thursday, Sept. 15.

We use armbands. Please wear your arm band while you are on the grounds. If you plan to leave and return on the same day, you must be wearing the arm band before re-entering or you will be required to buy another one. Arm bands are good for the entire day, including truck pulls on Friday and Saturday nights.

The Information Booth is located just inside the grounds, through the main gate. The booth is manned with volunteers armed with maps, schedules and other information. For information prior to the show, call 804-741-8468 or visit the website at [www.fielddayofthepast.net](http://www.fielddayofthepast.net). Pertinent information can be obtained from this number during show days, including changes due to inclement weather, but the phone is not manned. It will refer you to other numbers if you need to call. **Be aware, however, we receive a lot of calls on show days and make every effort to answer you, but this is not always possible.**

## Please Be Safe

First and foremost, make your trip a safe one. Observe all safety rules and adhere to staff requests, and keep track of the kids. Stay alert and let common sense be your guide. Advise children to be aware of moving equipment,

machinery and animals. Many exhibits are “hands on” and we encourage participation, but it is always best to ask before you touch. Please remain outside the pit area at the Tractor/Truck Pull track and watch for moving vehicles.

## Review the Schedule of Events

A schedule of activities is posted on the website and can be found in this guide. Although we try to include as much as possible, this schedule does not list every event. Review the schedule and plan your trip in accordance to those things you wish to see. Most activities are scheduled more than once a day and many are ongoing. The Information Booth will have updates on any schedule or location changes.

## Plan Your Visit

A map of the grounds is also available on the website and in this guide. Four photographic maps are also located on the field — one at the Information Booth, one as you enter the “pasture field”, one near the carnival area and one in the Heritage Village. These maps will allow you to place yourself in relation to other exhibits. Familiarize yourself with the grounds to save as many steps as possible. Trams make regular trips around the field. You may wish to catch one as soon as you arrive, take a circuit of the grounds and note our many exhibits. Select the ones you wish to revisit on foot. The tram makes regular stops around the grounds, You can get on or off at any of these stops. Note times for demonstrations and plan to visit the exhibits you like best early when they are not quite so crowded. Remember that the more crowded the grounds, the longer the tram trips.

Keep in mind, this is an outside event — rain or shine. There are some tents which provide shelter, but dress appropriately. It can be hot in September. Wear layers of clothing, bring a hat and wear comfortable shoes. No matter how much you intend to take the tram, you are probably going to have to do some walking, and this is a field. The ground is rough!

Also, please share your memories at Field Day on your social media.

## Take Advantage of What We Know

Many of the volunteers manning the exhibits and demonstrations have first hand knowledge of the skills they are exhibiting. If you have questions, please ask. Our exhibitors will be glad to answer your questions.

## Break Time

Field Day can be an overwhelming experience, particularly if this is your first visit. You cannot see everything in a few hours. Pace yourself and take into consideration the young and elderly in your party. In September, the weather can be variable — chilly in the morning and quite warm in the afternoon. Plan accordingly and set aside some “down time.”

All members of your party will need to take a break, take time to eat and just chill out, especially the youngest and elderly people with you. Take everyone’s comfort into consideration.

More than a dozen food vendors are located on the

grounds offering a variety of foods. There are crowds at peak meal times, however, so schedule meals earlier or later to avoid lines. There are plenty of vendors selling snow cones, lemonade and bottled water for a little “pick me up.”

## Keep Track of Party Members

There are a lot of people on the grounds during the show, so be especially watchful of tiny tots. In the event you are separated from others in your group, have a plan. Make sure small children know their first and last names and the names of the people they are with. Consider pinning a contact phone number to your child. Volunteers need this information to help. If small children misplace their parents, please report it immediately to a staff member or the Information Booth.

As soon as you arrive, designate an obvious place to meet should you get separated. If members in your party go their separate ways, have a meeting time and place designated beforehand.

## Restrooms are Available

S.B. Cox has provided portable toilets and hand washing stations which are scattered throughout the grounds. Please let staff know if a portajohn needs tending.

## Emergency Service

The Amelia Emergency Squad will have a presence on the grounds. Although we hope no one will need their services, there are times when cuts, splinters or the heat can get the best of us and it’s good to know volunteers are there to help. Report any medical needs to a staff member who can help you.

Amelia County Sheriff’s deputies will be on the grounds as well at times, and the Virginia State Police will maintain a presence at the event.

## Tram Service

Trams are available and inside the grounds. Handicapped Parking is available as well. Handicapped scooters and wheelchairs are allowed on the grounds, but personal ATVS are not due to insurance regulations

## Contact with the Outside World

No public phones are available on the grounds, but most cell phone companies service the area. If you need to meet with someone during the day, make arrangements outside the gates. Also make sure you have all medications and other necessary items before you leave home.

## Available Cash

The ticket booths accept CASH only. ATM machines will be located outside of the main gate

## Lost and Found

Any items found on the show grounds should be turned in at the Information Booth. If you lose something, check with these volunteers throughout the day. After the show, check with the Field Day office.

## Souvenirs

The Souvenir Shop is located just inside the front gate. Be sure to visit there for a memento of your trip to Field Day of the Past.





# Horseshoe pitching competitions have Grecian origins

One of the goals of Field Day of the Past is to preserve our history and tell the stories of our ancestors. Often we do not consider that some of that events and activities which take place during the annual show really can be traced back into our history. The annual horseshoe pitching competitions which Dixie Four Wheel Drive Club conducts each year is just such an event.

Historians believe that

horseshoe pitching evolved from the ancient sport of discus throwing — one of the sports of the ancient Grecian Olympian Games. From this, came the game of quoits, which evolved into horseshoes.

Some folklore says some ancient Grecian warriors could not afford discus and employed their used horseshoes instead.

Folklore states that the Duke of Wellington said of the American victory in the Revolutionary War

"the War was won by pitchers of horse hardware."

Rules were established in 1869 in England governing the game of horseshoe pitching. The Grand League of the American Horseshoe Pitchers Assoc. was the first governing body of horse shoe pitching. A constitution, rules and bylaws were established at that time.

The National Horseshoe Pitchers Assoc. (NHPA), which claims its origins

can be found in the competitions engaged in by Union soldiers during the American Civil War, was founded in May, 1921 in Ohio.

The first horseshoe pitching tournament in which competition was open to the World was held in the summer of 1910 in Bronson KS. Frank Jackson was the winner and took home a World Championship belt with horseshoes attached to it.

Rules and regulations have changed over the decades, but NHPA estimates that 15 million people in Canada and the U.S. enjoy the sport of horseshoe pitching for competition or simply for pleasure.


historic fun with the Dixie Four Wheel Drive Club's horseshoe pitching competitions.



# Field Day of the Past Safety Director offers advise for attending

## Field Day of the Past Safety Director

We are planning for Field Day of the Past September 2022 show, and want to offer these safety reminders for our many loyal patrons to best enjoy the three-day fun-filled event! We are very happy and proud to be celebrating our second year in Amelia County, and the 30th anniversary of the show. These safety tips and reminders can help us stay safe and healthy not only for your visit to the show but also year 'round.

### The 'Top Ten' Safety List:

#### \*Wear sturdy shoes.

Much of our walking surfaces are unpaved. In other words, leave the flip-flops at home. We learned this by tending to a few folks over the years who took a tumble wearing poorly selected footwear. Fortunately, none of the incidents were serious, but we can learn from it. Hiking boots or other sturdy shoes are best suited. We also recommend carrying a walking stick, because there are some gentle hills on the field.

#### \*Stay well hydrated — year 'round.

Mid-September can be steamy and hot, and most fair-goers will spend a long day taking in the many events. In addition to being on your feet and walking all day, the daytime temperatures can be downright hot. Proper hydration is more than just chugging a bottle of water on the day of your visit. We strongly recommend **WEARING A WIDE BRIM HAT** or use other protection from direct sun. A parasol, sun block, sombrero or other shielding is very helpful.

#### \*Manage your meds.

If you are taking any prescription medications, make sure the outdoor sun exposure is ok to tolerate. Some meds want you to avoid direct sun exposure.

#### \*Supervise your children.

We recommend attaching a name tag with a phone number on youngsters, in case of 'lost child', and take their picture on the day of your visit. This helps with identification in a crowd. Give the children an instruction on what to do if they become separated- i.e. find a volunteer or law enforcement officer. Children should be told to stay in one place if separated, because you will be retracing your steps to locate them.

**\*Caution around large animals.** At certain times during the day there could be loud noises from a variety of exhibits. These noises may startle an animal and if someone is standing too close by, or directly behind it, there could be a reaction. So keep clear and stay alert.

**\*Hand-washing stations** are located throughout the grounds and at animal exhibits. Please make sure you practice good hygiene by using the hand-washing facilities. Soap and water is more effective than sanitizer.

\*We have a **Handicapped access plan**, if anyone needs parking assistance and transport, just let the parking attendants know when you arrive.

We do not permit personal ATV's or similar conveyances on the grounds for safety reasons.

Amelia Fire and EMS staff are on the showground continuously throughout the show and will respond for first-aid if needed. Our Volunteer Staff will be wearing yellow vests, and if anyone needs assistance, just give them a holler.

Other safety concerns include:

**\*Hornet, Wasp or Bees** —If anyone has an allergy, such as a child, please make sure it is clearly communicated immediately to our first-aid crews.

### Carnival and Ride Safety

#### Follow all safety instructions for the ride or activity you in which you engage

There may be minimum height requirements on some rides and the need to use seatbelts and safety bars and other simple protections,

Stay well clear of the moving parts of all rides or machinery & equipment. Supervise children closely.

Respect fence or barrier tape lines anywhere on the field.

Do not carry accessories such as tote bags, knap-sacks, purses, unsecured phones, or hard case water bottles, etc. on rides. Objects can become dislodged during the ride and cause an issue.

All that rockin' and rollin' ride motion can be a bit disorienting so hold on when getting off.

Please observe the posted safety rules and enjoy the ride!

**\*Watch your step on & off rides**, tram cars, amusements, etc. Hold on to handrails going up or down stairs and steps, on and off trams and trolleys, etc.

We have a variety of food vendors on the Fairgrounds, however if anyone in your group has **dietary restrictions**, plan ahead with a picnic lunch.

Again, the most important part is drinking water or some of the delicious hand squeezed lemonade for hydration.

We try to provide seating in some areas however, if possible, bring a portable camp type chair for anyone in your group who may need an occasional rest break.


Remember, bringing alcohol onto the Fairgrounds is not permitted.

#### Caution when driving in and out of parking lots

Keep a slow speed because pedestrians may cross between and around vehicles.

Always check your rear before backing or have one of your group act as a spotter.

do a great job of keeping an orderly flow of traffic entering and leaving, but there can be some bottle-necks.

We advise you to arrive early on the day you want to visit. It's usually a bit cooler in the morning.

Please exercise patience when exiting the parking lots. Pedestrians have the right-of-way! The lot usually clears fairly quickly following the 'Grand Finale'

We monitor the weather closely, but in the event of sudden storm, lightning or other emergency, we will make a **PA announcement asking folks to return to their vehicle, but to please not try to leave.** The safest place in most situations is inside a parked vehicle. It would be unmanageable if everyone tried to leave at the same time. So please 'stay put.' If you need special assistance, notify one of our volunteers.

Finally, consider your pets. It's hot, noisy and crowded. If your pet is uncomfortable in these situations, please consider leaving him/her home. If Fido attends, please clean up after him.
