Volunteers are the heart of Field Day of the Past



Field Day of the Past survives because of its volunteers — they are the only reason this organization continues to function. Unfortunately, these days, volunteers are becoming harder and harder to find. People's lives have become so complicated with all the activities in which they are involved, there's little time left to give to someone else. That's why the few volunteers we do have play such a significant role in the perpetua-

tion of our programs. It never ceases to amaze me how so few people can get so much done, and because there are so few of them, the list of chores never gets shorter, it only gets longer. It astounds me that these people never seem daunted by the tasks laid out in front of them.

Volunteering is not a glamorous job. These are the people who work in the intense heat to keep the grounds cut and line trimmed and bushhog fields. They are the ones who show up days before an event to set up tents, tables, chairs, put out signs, move light plants and porta johns. They paint, repair, shuffle exhibits around, decorate for Christmas and then undecorate after the holiday event is over. They hang

banners, spend hours on the field laying out spaces, clean the grounds and buildings, show up at off site public relations events and deliver newspapers so others know about an up-

coming event.

Volunteers are the people who arrive in the early morning hours before an event to make sure all our bases are covered, and they remain on the

grounds until long after dark sets in.

It's volunteers who work the track during tractor and truck pulls events, oversee the operation of the Souvenir Shop, Information Booth, Ticket Booth and Registration Trailer. Volunteers run Grasberger's Spoon Machine and the Broom Handle machine, monitor the sound system, outfit the log cabin, oversee the antique tractor, small and large engine exhibits.

You may see a volunteer working a gate, or making a trip because we have run out of toilet paper for the bathrooms.

These are the people you come to depend on to make an event happen. They are the ones who have your back and step up to pick up the slack.

These are the folks who become your friends and, eventually, your extended family. When volunteers spend as much time together as Field Day volunteers do, you come to know their families, their habits, their misfortunes and who they really are. They become a part of your lives and you a part of theirs.

No, there is no monetary value in volunteering. Volunteers don't get a star beside their names on any list anywhere. There are no promotions, no raises. Oftentimes, volunteers are overlooked and under appreciated.

The only reward a volunteer reaps is the sense of belonging. The ties that bind volunteers makes each a part of something bigger than themselves, a sharing of friendships, memories — good and bad — and the satisfaction of accomplishing something for the greater good. Even when it rains on the parade, or the attendance is not what you wished for, even when the end result is not what you planned, there is still a sense of having done the best that you could and sharing that with someone else.

So, if you see a Field Day of the Past volunteer either during the show or out in public, thank them for what they do. Tell them what a good job they are doing and how important their involvement is. Without them, we would have nothing.

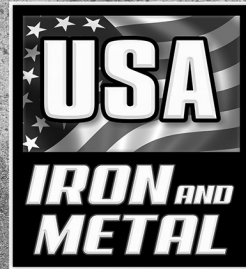

Online and block tickets prices drop to 2021 levels

For those who have not gotten the news yet, the Field Day of the Past Board of Directors voted in early Spring to roll back online and block tickets sale prices to 2021 rates. This year online tickets will be available for \$15, a savings of \$5 off tickets sold at the gates. Block tickets — a block of ten single day tickets — can be purchased for \$125 a block, that's a savings of \$75.

Block tickets are sold in sets of ten tickets. Each ticket is good for admission any one day of the event. The ten tickets do not all have to be used on the same day.

Online tickets can be purchased from the Field Day of the Past website, fielddayofthepast.net.

Click the Tickets tab and scroll down to the "Click

here to purchase tickets online" link.

Tickets can be purchased at the gate for \$20 per adult daily. Senior tickets are \$15 and can only be purchased at the gate. As always, children younger than 13 years of age are admitted free.

Admission tickets to Field Day of the Past include admittance to all attractions and exhibits, as well as the horse and mule pulls, the tractor pulls, the Friday and Saturday night truck pulls and music, including performance's on the sound stage, Mountain Highway's performance on Saturday and Sunday and Daybreak's performance on Sunday afternoon.

The cost of admission does not include the cost of carnival rides and

games, Dixie Four Wheel Drive's cornhole and horseshoe pitch competitions, pony rides, the mechanical bull, or other items which may be sold by our vendors or participants.

Those who purchase online tickets and those who have block tickets should enter the grounds through the Pedestrian Gate across from the parking lot.

Gates open at 8 a.m. daily. Most displays and exhibits close at 6 p.m. The carnival remains open until 10 p.m.

Truck pulls are scheduled for 7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 20 and 6 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21.

Most exhibits close at 6 p.m. but the grounds remain open until the pulls are finished on Friday and Saturday. Gates close at 6 p.m. Sunday..

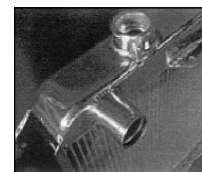

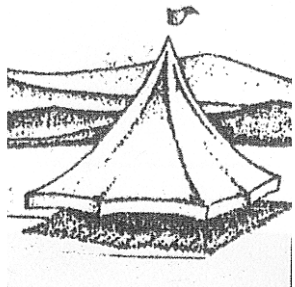

Survival Guide

Welcome to Field Day of the Past 2024!

We would like your visit to be a pleasant and fun one. We have designed these tips to provide information on what you are about to experience and some suggestions to help you make the most of your time with us. Browse through the guide before you leave home, and bring it with you.

Who, What, When and Where

Let us introduce ourselves. Field Day of the Past is an annual event sponsored by the Rockville-Centerville Steam & Gas Historical Assoc, a nonprofit organization operating under Section 501(c)(3) of the Codes of the Internal Revenue Service. The event is organized and manned by volunteers and we always welcome a new face.

The show grounds are located at Redfield Farm, 11404 Circle Dr. just off Rt. 360 in Amelia County five miles east of Amelia Courthouse. This address is the Appomattox River Park and Ride. The grounds are directly behind the parking lot. Signs will be posted on Rt. 360 from both directions to direct you into the parking lot. Parking is free. **The best way to avoid the traffic is to arrive early, particularly on Saturday.**

Show days are Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 20-22. The gates open at 8 a.m. and most exhibits shut down at 6 p.m. Truck events are held at 7 p.m. on Friday and 6 p.m. on Saturday. Sunday hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Adult admission is \$20 per person per day. Guests 65 and older will be admitted for \$15. Children 12 years and younger are free.

Tickets are available online at fielddayofthepast.net for \$15 daily and block tickets are available for \$125 for ten single day tickets. Block tickets will remain on sale until noon on Thursday, Sept. 19.

If you wish to leave the grounds and return on the same day, be sure to have your hand stamped. This will allow you to re-enter on the same day, only.

The Information Booth is located just inside the grounds, through the main gate. The booth is manned with volunteers armed with maps, schedules and other information. For information prior to the show, call 804-741-8468 or visit the website at www.fielddayofthepast.net. Pertinent information can be obtained from this number during show days, including changes due to inclement weather, but the phone is not manned. It will refer you to other numbers you may need to call. **Be aware, however, we receive a lot of calls on show days and, although we make every effort to answer you this is not always possible. We will do our best to update any changes on Facebook.**

Please Be Safe

First and foremost, make your trip a safe one. Observe all safety rules, adhere to staff requests, and keep track of the kids. Stay alert and let common sense be your guide. Advise children to be aware of moving equipment, machinery and animals. Many exhibits are “hands on” and we encourage participation, but it is always best to ask before you touch. Please remain outside the pit area at the Tractor/Truck Pull track and watch for moving vehicles.

Review the Schedule of Events

A schedule of activities is posted on the website and can

be found in this guide. Although we try to include as much as possible, this schedule does not list every event. Review the schedule and plan your trip in accordance to those things you wish to see. Most activities are scheduled more than once a day and many are ongoing. The Information Booth will have updates on any schedule or location changes.

Plan Your Visit

A map of the grounds is also available on the website and in this guide. Four photographic maps are also located on the field — one at the Information Booth, one as you enter the “pasture field”, one near the carnival area and one in the Heritage Village. These maps will allow you to place yourself in relation to other exhibits. Familiarize yourself with the grounds to save as many steps as possible. Trams make regular trips around the field. You may wish to catch one as soon as you arrive, take a circuit of the grounds and note our many exhibits. Select the ones you wish to revisit on foot. The tram makes regular stops around the grounds. You can get on or off at any of these stops. Note times for demonstrations and plan to visit the exhibits you like best early when they are not quite so crowded. Remember that the more crowded the grounds, the longer the tram trips.

Keep in mind, this is an outside event — rain or shine. There are some tents which provide shelter, but dress appropriately. It can be hot in September. Wear layers of clothing, bring a hat and wear comfortable shoes. No matter how much you intend to take the tram, you are probably going to have to do some walking, and this is a field. The ground is rough!

Also, please share your memories at Field Day on your social media.

Take Advantage of What We Know

Many of the volunteers manning the exhibits and demonstrations have first hand knowledge of the skills they are exhibiting. If you have questions, please ask. Our exhibitors will be glad to answer your questions.

Break Time

Field Day can be an overwhelming experience, particularly if this is your first visit. You cannot see everything in a few hours. Pace yourself and take into consideration the young and elderly in your party. In September, the weather can be variable — chilly in the morning and quite warm in the afternoon. Plan accordingly and set aside some “down time.”

All members of your party will need to take a break, take time to eat and just chill out, especially the youngest and elderly people with you. Take everyone’s comfort into consideration.

More than a dozen food vendors are located on the grounds offering a variety of foods. There are crowds at peak meal times, however, so schedule meals earlier or later to avoid lines. There are plenty of vendors selling snow cones, lemonade and bottled water for a little “pick me up.”

Keep Track of Party Members

There are a lot of people on the grounds during the show, so be especially watchful of tiny tots. In the event you are separated from others in your group, have a plan.

Make sure small children know their first and last names and the names of the people they are with. Consider pinning a contact phone number to your child. Volunteers need this information to help. If small children misplace their parents, please report it immediately to a staff member or the Information Booth.

As soon as you arrive, designate an obvious place to meet should you get separated. If members in your party go their separate ways, have a meeting time and place designated beforehand.

Restrooms are Available

Portable toilets and hand washing stations are scattered throughout the grounds. Please let staff know if a portable toilet needs tending so we can correct the problem.

Emergency Service

The Amelia County Emergency Squad will have a presence on the grounds. Although we hope no one will need their services, there are times when cuts, splinters or the heat can get the best of us, and it’s good to know volunteers are there to help. Report any medical needs to a staff member who can help you.

Amelia County Sheriff’s deputies will be on the property as well, and the Virginia State Police will maintain a presence at the event.

Tram Service

Trams are available inside the grounds. Handicapped Parking is available as well. Handicapped scooters and wheelchairs are allowed on the grounds, but personal ATVs are not due to insurance regulations

Contact with the Outside World

No public phones are available on the grounds, but most cell phone companies service the area. If you need to meet with someone during the day, make arrangements outside the gates. Also make sure you have all medications and other necessary items before you leave home.

Available Cash

Credit card machines are available at Gate C only. ATM machines will be located outside of the main gate (Gate C).

Lost and Found

Any items found on the show grounds should be turned in at the Information Booth. If you lose something, check with these volunteers throughout the day. After the show, check with the Field Day office.

Souvenirs

The Souvenir Shop is located just inside the front gate. Be sure to visit there for a memento of your trip to Field Day of the Past.

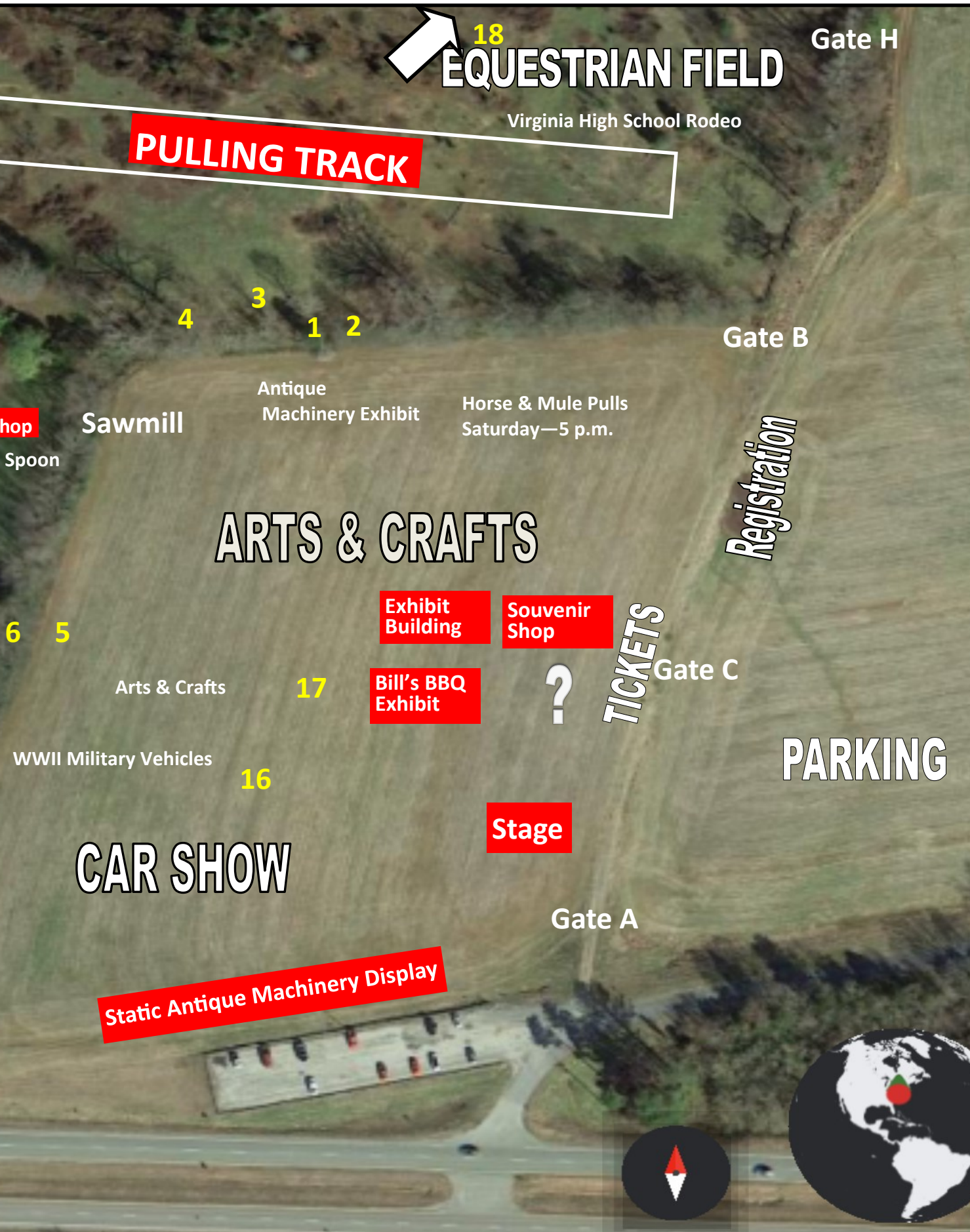

Visitors to this year's Field Day of the Past will notice some changes and additions. We are moving some of the exhibits and displays around in, what we see, as a more appealing and visitor friendly arrangement. Arts and Crafts will be moving to the front field and the majority of the activities and events will move to the pasture field.

We have also added new attractions, exhibits and displays this year.

Near AGLand, Julie Poudrier's dogs will show off their skills at herding sheep. These demonstrations will take place on Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 21 and 22 during the annual event.

In Heritage Village, several new attractions have

been added. Randy and Sara Lyn King from North Carolina, will make Shaker style brooms with a foot operated winder.

Jen Cardwell with JC Caning, from New Kent, will be demonstrating the art of chair caning.

The art of seat weaving dates

back to 4000 BC in Egypt with natural rush seats. Chair caning originated in China centuries before it was brought westward by the opening of the China Trade. Caning has recently experienced a surge in popularity in furniture and interior decoration. Customers are consistently restoring cherished heirlooms.

Carwell will also have woven stools and Scandinavian Star and Crosses for sale.

Also new in Heritage Village is Nathan Jenkins, the Bodging Bigfoot, from Waynesboro. Jenkins bills himself as an American Bodger, blacksmith, producer of hand carved treene, basket makers etc. Bodging is defined as a traditional woodturning craft, using green (unseasoned) wood to make chair legs and other cylindrical parts of chairs. (Treen is a small domestic item, usually an antique)

Visit Jenkins and watch him engage in wooden bowl and spoon making.

There are other "olden" crafts, trades and lifestyles exemplified in Heritage Village. If you ladies think washing clothes is a chore nowadays, just stop by and see what Carolyn Longest has to go through washing her clothes by hands.

As in many Virginia locales, growing tobacco was a way of life with many county farmers. In 1922, Amelia Courthouse was home to two tobacco warehouses. In a tribute to the hard life of a tobacco farmer, this year Field Day will offer a tobacco exhibit, showcasing the many facets

of tobacco.

Manned by Field Day volunteers James Harrison, who grew up raising tobacco and Roy Bryant, the exhibit will feature historic tobacco photographs, tobacco related items, and perhaps even a tobacco planter.

Please be sure to spend some time at this exhibit, and learn that tobacco

farming was not a glorious occupation, and often, not even a profitable one.

Tips for a safe visit from Field Day of the Past Safety Director

Here we are, another year has passed so fast! This is my second favorite time of the year...only Christmas commands first, but there are many others as well.

I have many wonderful memories of my childhood and becoming an adult. Times have changed. A wish of mine is that the young people will come to Field Day of the Past and experience the way their parents, and of course, their Grandma and Grandpa, and their ancestors used to accomplish every day chores and jobs. Field Day of the Past is one of the last existing events that demonstrates how life was in the past. There were no pagers, cell phones, computers, or X-Box and Play Stations, just to name a few. Now our children and the younger generation are used to having everything at their fingertips.

We at Field Day of the Past have been working very hard to bring the past to you and your family — remembering that this is how great grandma and grandpa used to live. Forget about air conditioning, running water, hot water (unless it was heated on the wood stove) and even electricity

Many people have never watched a full episode of “The Waltons.” This is one of many examples of how people lived so many years ago.

So...at Field Day of the Past, we very much enjoy bringing you a look at history through a live action event.

We must preserve our history to enable the next generation to appreciate how their ancestors helped to shape the future.

volunteering for Field Day of the Past, or becoming a member, please call us at 804-741-846. We want you to enjoy your visit to Field Day of the Past. Because of this, we are offering some tips and guidelines for a very enjoyable experience.

Top Ten Safety List *Wear sturdy shoes.

Much of our walking surfaces are unpaved. In other words, leave the flip-flops at home. We learned this by tending to a few folks over the years who took a tumble wearing poorly selected footwear. Hiking boots or other sturdy shoes are best suited. We also recommend carrying a walking stick, because there are some gentle hills on the field.

***Stay well hydrated** — year ‘round.

Mid-September can be steamy and hot, and most fair-goers will spend a long day taking in the many events. In addition to being on your feet and walking all day, the daytime temperatures can be downright hot. Proper hydration is more than just chugging a bottle of water. We strongly recommend WEARING A WIDE BRIM HAT or use other protection from direct sun—a parasol, sun block, sombrero or other shielding is very helpful.

*Manage your meds.

If you are taking any prescription medications, make sure the outdoor sun exposure is ok to tolerate. Some meds want you to avoid direct sun exposure.

*Supervise the children.

We recommend attaching a name tag with a phone number on youngsters, in case of ‘lost child’, and take their picture on the day of your visit. This helps with identification in a crowd. Give

the child instructions on what to do if they become separated- i.e. find a volunteer or law enforcement officer. Children should be told to stay in one place if separated, because you will be retracing your steps to locate them.

*Caution around large animals.

At certain times during the day there could be loud noises from a variety of exhibits. These noises may startle an animal and if someone is standing too closely, or directly behind it, there could be a reaction. So keep clear and stay alert.

***Hand-washing stations** are located throughout the grounds and at animal exhibits. Please make sure you practice good hygiene by using the hand-washing facilities. Soap and water is more effective than sanitizer.

***We have a Handicapped access plan.** If anyone needs parking assistance and transport, just let the parking attendants know when you arrive.

We do not permit personal ATV’s or similar conveyances on the grounds for safety reasons. Amelia Fire and EMS staff are on the showground continuously throughout the show and will respond for first-aid if needed. Our Volunteer Staff will be wearing yellow vests, and if anyone needs assistance, just give them a holler.

***Hornet, Wasp or Bees** If anyone has an allergy, such as a child, please make sure it is clearly communicated immediately to our first-aid crews.

Carnival and Ride Safety Follow all safety instructions for the ride or activity in which you engage. There may be minimum height requirements on

some rides and the need to use seatbelts and safety bars and other simple protections.

Stay well clear of the moving parts of all rides or machinery and equipment. Supervise children closely.

Respect fence or barrier tape lines anywhere on the field.

Do not carry accessories such as tote bags, knapsacks, purses, unsecured phones, or hard case water bottles, etc. on rides. Objects can become dislodged during the ride and cause an issue.

All that rockin’ and rollin’ ride motion can be a bit disorienting so hold on when getting off.

Please observe the posted safety rules and enjoy the ride!

***Watch your step** on and off rides, tram cars, amusements, etc. Hold on to handrails going up or down stairs and steps, on and off trams and trolleys, etc.

We have a variety of food vendors on the Fairgrounds, however if anyone in your group has dietary restrictions, plan ahead with a picnic lunch.

Again, the most important part is drinking water or some of the delicious hand squeezed lemonade for hydration.

We try to provide seating in some areas however, if possible, bring a portable camp type chair for anyone in your group who may need an occasional rest break.

Remember, bringing alcohol onto the Fairgrounds is not permitted. Take caution when driving in and out of parking lots.

Keep a slow speed because pedestrians may cross between and around vehicles.

Always check your rear

before backing or have one of your group act as a spotter.

Our parking lot attendants and Amelia County officers do a great job of keeping an orderly flow of traffic entering and leaving, but there can be some bottle-necks.

We advise you to arrive early on the day you want to visit. It’s usually a bit cooler in the morning.

Please exercise patience when exiting the parking lots. Pedestrians have the right-of-way! The lot usually clears fairly quickly following the ‘Grand Finale’.

We monitor the weather closely, but in the event of

sudden storm, lightning or other emergency, we will make a PA announcement asking folks to return to their vehicle, but to please not try to leave. The safest place in most situations is inside a parked vehicle. It would be unmanageable if everyone tried to leave at the same time. So please ‘stay put.’ If you need special assistance, notify one of our volunteers.

Finally, consider your pets. It’s hot, noisy and crowded. If your pet is uncomfortable in these situations, please consider leaving him/her home. If Fido attends, please clean up after him.
